

Frequently Asked Questions

What is a 'Cancer key worker'?

A 'Key worker' is offered as your key point of contact and usually will be a Colorectal Nurse Specialist. She helps you to understand more about bowel cancer and its treatment and is also available to talk through your concerns such as any physical, social, practical, emotional or spiritual needs. You will be allocated a Cancer key worker at the point of diagnosis or during your treatment.

What is a Holistic needs assessment? (HNA)

The assessment focuses on you as a whole and not just your illness. It includes suggestions and support to help manage emotional, physical and practical worries.

The things you can discuss at the assessment are:

- Symptoms and physical concerns. You may feel anxious about your illness or about the changes in your body.
- Feeling and emotions. It can be helpful to discuss your reactions, especially if you are feeling very worried or low.
- Any relationship issues. It may be that the relationships you have with friends, your family or your partner have changed. Sexual relationships can be affected.
- Money worries, you may want to know more about financial help available to you.

The assessment may be carried out at various stages throughout your treatment. It is not compulsory but you may benefit from it.

It can take place over the phone or in person when you attend other appointments.

The nurse completing the assessment will be your key worker and known to you, they will be happy to talk about whatever issues are important to you.

The nurse can give you contact details of organisations or services that could help with your concerns, such as Macmillan benefits team or a dietitian.

You will be given a copy of the assessment. It may be shared with other members of the health care team if it will help with your care.

If I cannot make a stoma appointment what do I do?

If you are unable to attend a stoma appointment, please contact the Colorectal Nursing team and we will reschedule this for you. Please phone as soon as you can so other patients can be allocated your cancellation.

What do I do if I have a problem with my stoma?

You need to contact our Colorectal Nursing Team. If you experience abdominal pain, nausea or vomiting, passing blood, feeling generally unwell or are concerned about your general health please contact your GP or out of hours service.

I have some general stoma questions

If you have general stoma questions please contact our Colorectal Nursing team or leave a message and we will call you back. Please leave your name, hospital or PID number and a brief description of the issue.

Do we do a text messaging service?

We can deliver a text message to your mobile or home phone to remind you of your forthcoming appointment. From time to time we will also be sending out a brief survey to gather patient experience to improve services. If you do not wish to receive reminder text messages then please let us know.

I would like clarification on the treatment or diagnosis

If you would like clarification on your treatment or diagnosis then please contact our Colorectal Nursing team. If we are unable to answer please leave a message and we will call you back. Please leave your name, hospital or PID number and a brief description of the issue.

I have questions related to my Chemotherapy/Radiotherapy treatment

If your questions are chemotherapy or radiotherapy related please contact us and ask for your cancer key worker. If your query is regarding oncology appointments or cancellations please contact your oncology secretary.
