<b>Can your child receive this service?</b>	<p>The Children’s Learning Disability Nursing Service assess and manage the health needs of children and young people aged 0-18years with:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The child or young person has a Moderate to Severe Learning Disability and an additional health need</li> <li>• The child or young person is aged between 0-18 years old</li> <li>• The child must be registered with a Solihull GP</li> </ul>
<b>Who can refer the child to the service?</b>	<p>Referral can be made by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Parents</li> <li>• Professionals</li> <li>• Any other agency</li> </ul> <p>Each child or young person will be assessed by either a home visits or on the supporting information gathered from the refer. This may result on the child coming into the service or signposted to another more relevant service.</p>
<b>How to complain about anything related to the service you have received</b>	<p>The service actively seeks and values your views and experience of the service. Any concerns should be raised with your child’s nurse. If you feel this is not appropriate you should contact the Team Leader of the service. The Heart of England NHS Trust has a formal complaints procedure and the Clinical Lead for the service can guide you through the process.</p>

<p><b>Learning/curriculum support</b></p>	<p>There is no universal support offered by this service. The Children's Learning Disability Nursing Services are targeted or specialists due to the child's health need requiring specialist nursing care and support.</p>	<p>The targeted support is for school and school nurse staff to support children with specialist nursing needs and to provide information for the health care plan so that the needs of your child are planned for in the community setting. The service will provide support for your child's move from home to nursery, from nursery to school and ensure that information is shared to support your child.</p>	<p>The Childrens Learning Disability Team is available to your child if needed, to provide specialist interventions for children and young people with moderate to severe learning difficulties Examples of specialist nursing services provided are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Toilet management</li> <li>• Sleep management</li> <li>• Behavioural management</li> <li>• Health care Plans</li> <li>• Contributing to MDT/Annual reviews/TAF meetings in school</li> <li>• Specialist Training</li> <li>• Liaising with Paediatricians</li> <li>• Short breaks referrals</li> <li>• Environmental assessments</li> <li>• Onward referrals</li> </ul>

The training involves a combination of formal training, staff observation and supervision prior to educational staff being assessed as competent.</p>	<p>Bespoke training package delivered for education staff when specified in an Education, Health, Social Care Plan or Statement of Educational Needs.</p>
